EGYPT CALLING

End Time Harvesters are members of a ministry team who touched the lives of people in Cairo, Egypt. There were ten team members, one group ministered to members of Coptic evangelical churches. The sisters were part of the second team. This team included a pastor from Texas, and a 23 year old dynamic evangelist from Kentucky. They ministered to full gospel church groups.

In 1992 revival swept across Egypt. There was a mighty outpouring of the Holy Spirit. People witnessed miracles, and many were healed of their diseases. This spontaneous work of the Holy Spirit moved in the midst of Orthodox, Catholic and Protestant churches. Thousands of nominal Christians returned to the faith and Muslims came know Christ as Savior and Lord. There was communal tensions, and increased persecution of the church. This persecution resulted in uniting brothers and sisters in Christ, and also united Orthodox and Protestant leaders in Egypt. We praise the Lord that this revival brought about a marked increase in intercessory prayer and receptivity in the hearts of men, women, and children as they were ministered to in Evangelistic Meetings, Home Visitation and Hospital Visitation.

During Evangelistic Meetings lives were changed as they were touched by the power of God. Many witnessed salvation, and were delivered from demonic oppression and possession. The sisters were used by the Lord to a new level of intercession as "Aarons and Hurs" in holding up the ministry hands of their 23 year old evangelist team member, as he ministered with a new level of anointing. As the three sisters and their team members ministered to Egyptian families during Home Visitation ministry, they witnessed a bedridden man rise and walk. He also received sight in his right eye. Another man was deaf and dumb, he was prayed for, he then received his hearing and his tongue was loosed.

The team's Hospital Visitation brought dramatic changes to many patients' lives. One of the highlights during this ministry centered on a converted Muslim man who attended our host pastors' church. (We will call him Ali for security reasons.) Ali had been diagnosed with terminal liver cancer and was told by his doctors just before our arrival, that there was nothing more they could do for him. The medical staff was going to discharge him, but he requested to remain in the hospital a few days longer. His reason for the request was that a few days earlier Jesus had appeared to him in a vision and told him that he was to have visitors from another country, these visitors would pray for him and he would be healed.

Ali later related, that as soon as the sisters and their team entered his hospital room, Jesus spoke to him and said, "These are the people who will pray for you and you will be healed." Simultaneously the Holy Spirit spoke to the pastor in the group, that we were the ones who should pray for Ali's healing. When we entered Ali's room we thought we were looking at a corpse. We sat next to him; he then opened his eyes and grasped Daphne's hand firmly. As we prayed with him in the Spirit, Ali then raised his hands,

and presence of the Holy Spirit filled the room. Ali's face lit up and his whole countenance changed. He jumped out of bed, stood firmly on his feet. Ali looked with admiration at his wife, sister and a family friend. He asked his wife for a hair comb, combed his hair, straightened his pajamas and slipped his feet into his sandals. Ali testified to his wife and family members that Jesus had healed him. He then requested to have his photograph taken with the team.

Later in the evening at a church service our Egyptian host pastor greeted us with a praise report. Ali's wife had called him to report that during the regular hospital rounds the doctors had examined Ali, and found no evidence of cancer in his body, and they immediately discharged him from the hospital. Hallelujah!

We also witnessed miracles of healing and salvation in the Leukemia ward of the hospital. There were two teenage Muslim girls present in the ward. One of the girls' mothers approached us, and with tears streaming down her face, said she was a Muslim, but wanted us to pray to Jesus to heal her daughter. We sensed in our Spirit that this mother received Jesus Christ as her personal Savior. Later she had the joy of seeing her daughter receive Jesus as Savior, and also received Jesus as her healer from Leukemia.

We witnessed the exact same miracles of salvation and healing of another teenaged girl. This girls' uncle stood guard at her bedside for the entire duration of our visit. He also requested the attending nurse to forbid us from going near the girl, and we could not touch her while we prayed for her.

Our last visit was with an 11 year old boy. The boys' father was present during our visit and greeted us cordially. This young boys' heart was very receptive to the gospel, and with childlike faith he readily received God's whole package of salvation and healing! All Glory to God! The Lord later gave us the added joy of seeing this young boy and his father happily strolling hand-in-hand in the beautiful gardens outside the hospital.

Our God is indeed an awesome God. To Him be all the Glory!

His name was Niranjan. He spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the Hindus of India. He was not known world-wide as an evangelist. He did not speak on the talk shows on Christian Television. Niranjan never traveled the world. He ministered far from the world stage. In his ministry world were small villages more than 100 kilometers from Cuttack, India. Many of these villages have dirt streets and small homes made from straw and mud. Cuttack is a city that is more than one thousand years old, it is located in southeastern India. To travel to Cuttack you must first go to Calcutta and take an overnight train south. Niranjan's ministry world was never on the tourist circuit. The rich and famous never visited his world.

On April 23, 2009 Niranjan received a promotion to the portals of Heaven. His body was racked with Malaria, and the Savior took Him home. During his ministry he planted one church, 15 home fellowship groups and 3 prayer groups. Niranjan was faithful. In his quiet way he ministered to the people who lived around him. He completed the task that God had called him to. We are thankful for the ministry of Niranjan. Those persons who he led to the Savior will see him again. Well done Niranjan, thy good and faithful servant, enter into the Joy of our Lord.
